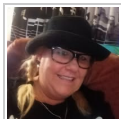

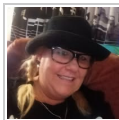
Yes,Keith talks about him & tells me stories about how he pronounced Milk, also what a hard working man he was. I'm sorry for your loss and may he RIP ..
