



Silas Leroy "Bud" Jackson

February 5, 1934 - October 12, 2018

Silas Leroy "Bud" Jackson formerly of Annapolis, MO passed away on Friday, October 12, 2018 at the age of 84 years, 8 months, and 10 days. He was born February 5, 1934 in Annapolis, MO to the late Crayton Silas Jackson and Verna Mann Jackson and raised by his father and second mother Helen Bridenthal Jackson.

On May 2, 1953 Bud, as he was known by everyone, was united in marriage to Elizabeth Terrell who survives. To this union two children were born; Vic (Donna) Jackson of Annapolis, and Richard Leroy Jackson.

Bud is survived by his loving wife Elizabeth, his son Vic (Donna) Jackson of Annapolis, two brothers; Jim (Anita) Jackson of Claremore, OK, and Dr. John (Paula) Jackson of Farmington, two sisters; Virginia "Pal" Dinkins formerly of Annapolis, and Elaine (Rev.
