Virginia Lee "Pal" Dinkins, née Jackson, formerly of Annapolis, MO went home to be with her Lord and Savior on Sunday, November 3, 2019, at the age of 86 years, 8 months, and 12 days at Meadowbrook Residential Assisted Living in Pilot Knob, MO.
